Social Justice initiatives—After inspiring us with her speech at assembly, about the impact of Cyclone Winston on her Fijian village, Chelsea Turner returned to school last Friday. To start Chelsea's fundraising campaign, **Fiji Fix Up**, we set

up a House-based coin trail and raised almost \$450 from gold, silver and bronze coins. This was an incredibly generous response by our students and staff as they showed their tangible support for Chelsea's efforts. Many of our families will be aware that Estelle Arundell (Head Boarder 2015) has opted for a Gap year with the Lattitude programme prior to going to University. Estelle is teaching in a village in Malawi until August, and endeavouring to raise sponsorship funds to enable poverty stricken families to keep their children in school.



The term has been busy, with girls making the most of opportunities to research future options. Liaison staff from Otago Polytech, CPIT Aoraki and the University of Canterbury have all visited, with a group of girls attending the Otago Law Function at Roncalli. Victoria University is scheduled to present at 9am on 15 April, prior to the marae visit. A dietician will lead the Incubator session on 1 April and Dave Moore, (HR at SCDHB), will complete the session with tips on CVs and interview techniques. The Incubator sessions occur during the Year 12 Career Module, however, senior students with an interest in the featured career are welcome to sign up.
