Summer Quadrangular Tournament—Five Craighead teams took part in the Summer Quad this week, hosted by Rangi Ruru in Christchurch. We competed in Debating, Volleyball, Tennis, Touch and Swimming against our sister city schools—Rangi Ruru, St Margaret's College and St Hilda's Collegiate. There were

some very pleasing individual performances, and each of our teams showed significant improvement in performance over the two days of intense competition. It was lovely to see several of our parents supporting our girls from the side-lines. Thanks to the staff, coaches and managers who supported our students. We also thank Rangi Ruru for hosting and billeting all the competitors, and look forward to, once again, taking our turn to host Quad Tournaments in the future, utilising our new gymnasium facilities. All students enjoyed being billeted and forming new, or rekindling old, friendships.

Red Girdle Award—Two years ago, Craighead teaching staff reviewed the traditional Red Girdle Award. There had been a lot of informal discussion about its relevance for today's young women. It is extremely difficult to determine who should receive this award, as it has had very subjective criteria that is difficult to define. The award itself stems from "Drill" which was practiced during war times, and has had several iterations since then, as previous Headmistresses have tried to firm up selection criteria. At the end of 2017, the staff made the (majority) decision not to continue with the award in its current form. We believe that it is an outdated concept and that there may be better alternatives available—which we are in the process of investigating (which will include a 'service' component).

HOD Languages—We are pleased to announce that we have appointed Mr Joaquin Ginés Rodriguez to the position of HOD Languages. Of Spanish descent, he is an experienced, New Zealand trained teacher who is able to teach both French and Spanish to Senior levels. We are lucky to have attracted someone of his calibre. Mr Ginés Rodriguez will begin at Craighead in Term Three, bringing with him his New Zealand-born wife, Margaret, and their two young children. The family are looking forward to moving to Timaru after living in Auckland for the past ten years. 
