

spent Tuesday in school. As well as speaking with the staff and pastoral team, he had an hour with the whole school, a session with Year 10 and an evening meeting with a group of parents. His visit was very well received apart from the subject being topical and timely, John is a charismatic speaker who has no trouble in relating closely with any group with whom he works.

The essence of his approach is that cyber safety is not primarily about technology—the technology is simply the tool. To keep ourselves safe, we need to concentrate on our own self-esteem and our belief structure so that our digital personality reflects the qualities of our character, not our flaws. Of course, there are many practical tips he shared that we should employ to keep ourselves safe—the digital world and its emphasis on instant communication provides many challenges, however, his message that if we pause and think before we act digitally, the chances of problems are much less. Across the school there has been affirmation of his presentation and considerable discussion about ways to practically implement his ideas.
